This table uses the Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG) 2026 to 2027 financial year allocations summary produced by the Department for Education. It uses data relating to block allocations after deductions for academies recoupment, national non-domestic rates and direct funding of high needs places by the DfE divided by mainstream primary and secondary school pupil numbers. This methodology ensures simplicity, certainty and transparency of data and avoids complexities related to wider age ranges due to reduced alignment with required provision.
